ORDINANCE 2020-35

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR AND FINANCE DIRECTOR TO DEVELOP AND EXECUTE A SMALL BUSINESS GRANT PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE THEREOF AND, FURTHER, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Funds were awarded to the State of Ohio, to the County of Wood and to the Municipality of Northwood as Federal Financial Assistance from the U.S. Department of Treasury; and,

WHEREAS, these funds were awarded under the Social Security Act, as amended by Section 5001 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") as the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF); and,

WHEREAS, The City of Northwood received an allocation of those "CARES" Act Funds; and,

WHEREAS, A portion of these funds have been set aside by the City of Northwood and City Council to provide economic support for small business assistance related to required and/or voluntary closures and the expenditures related to providing these programs.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF NORTHWOOD, WOOD COUNTY, OHIO, THAT

SECTION 1. This Council hereby authorizes and directs the City Administrator and Finance Director, on behalf of the City, to execute the Small Business Grant Program, as indicated by the "application document" and attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and to take such steps, and to provide such information and certifications, as are necessary and appropriate to carry out and administer the loan program.

SECTION 2. This Small Business Grant Program is being established for active City of Northwood business with less than 25 employees.

SECTION 3. Applications will be received by the City until the end of the business day on November 20th, 2020 and the final amount if the distribution will be determined by November 30th, 2020.

SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of council concerning or relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the City of Northwood and the State of Ohio.

SECTION 5. That this proposed Ordinance should be declared an emergency for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and to improve the economic welfare of the people; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and in effect immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor.


