AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT WITH WOOD COUNTY, OHIO FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THE COUNTY'S FY2016 COMMUNITY HOUSING IMPACT AND PRESERVATION PROGRAM (CHIP) GRANT APPLICATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Wood County will be submitting an FY16 CHIP Grant application to the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA); and

WHEREAS, ODSA has determined that the City of Northwood is an eligible program participant to partner with Wood County under the FY16 CHIP Program, and

WHEREAS, the partnership will enable Wood County to apply for \$450,000 and Northwood \$350,000 for a total grant of \$800,000 for housing assistance to income eligible households; and

WHEREAS, without this partnership arrangement, Wood County would have been eligible for only \$400,000 of CHIP Grant Funds; and

WHEREAS, Wood County has agreed to be the grantee and fiscal agent for the entire FY16 CHIP Grant; and

WHEREAS, Wood County has agreed to retain and track the FY16 CHIP Program Income for future housing assistance to income eligible households in both Northwood and Wood County; and

WHEREAS, Northwood agrees with the stipulations of the Program Partnership Agreement delineated in the attached CHIP Program Partnership Agreement between the City of Northwood and Wood County, Ohio,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHWOOD, OHIO THAT:

- Section 1.** The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a partnership agreement with Wood County for the submission of Wood County's FY16 CHIP Application due on May 6, 2016.
- Section 2.** Partnering with the County will enable Northwood and Wood County to apply for \$800,000 of CHIP Grant Funds.
- Section 3.** Wood County has agreed to be the Grantee for this program and be responsible for the administration and implementation of the FY16 CHIP Grant.
- Section 4.** Wood County will be the fiscal agent for the entire grant and will be responsible for the prerequisite fund drawdowns, status and monitoring reports.
- Section 5.** Wood County will retain, track and administer the CHIP Program Income and use it to assist other eligible households in both Northwood and Wood County.
- Section 6.** Northwood agrees to enter into the attached Partnership Agreement with Wood County for the County FY16 CHIP Grant and agrees to the stipulations included therein.
- Section 7.** It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in

and any of its subcommittees that resulted in such formal actions were in Ordinance Nmeetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 122.22 of the Ohio Revised Code of Ohio and that the reading and adoption of this Ordinance complies with the provisions of Article III, Section 3.11 of the City Charter.

Section 8. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare. The reason for the emergency is that this joint City and County CHIP Application is due to the state on May 6, 2016.
